4. Overview 4.1 Background information	The Department of Hepatopancreatobiliary/Transplant surgery was formed at the Singapore General Hospital since April 2013. We have a long history of training regional doctors/fellows previously registered under General Surgery. We intend to pursue this tradition and commitment to train regional doctors for hepatobiliary and transplant work. SGH currently serves a regional tertiary referral centre for hepatobiliary diseases. We are committed to pursuing advanced diagnostic tools and latest surgical technology to our patients. This will benefit the development of expertise and skills around the region. This is done through conducting workshops and seminars for Fellows place in our one-year programme. They are placed initially for six months, and a further period of 6 months upon satisfactory progress (total of one year).

4.3 Duration	6 to 12 months  The syllabus remains the same for both 6 months and 12 months fellowship.  12 months duration will allow more accumulated experience of rarer cases and more advanced hands-on experiences in major and complex HPB procedures e.g. liver and pancreas resection and liver transplantation.

	Been certified to be of good standing by the Medical Council or the relevant national authority  Note: The doctor should be in active clinical practice (and been registered as a medical practitioner in the countries of practice) for the 3 years preceding the application for medical registration in Singapore.  In addition to the above criteria, Clinical Fellows must:  a) Have a minimum of 3 years working experience as a medical officer (or equivalent)  b) Fulfil English Language requirements of SMC if the medium of instruction for the basic medical qualification is not in English  c) Preferably have obtained a postgraduate diploma or medical degree in his country or overseas  d) Be sponsored by (i) the government, or (ii) regional health authority or (iii) an appropriate institution in the home country. For (d)(iii), the doctor must be on current full-time employment (40 hours or more per week) with the sponsoring institution.  As a Clinical Fellow, the doctor will be allowed to be involved in patient care and make entries in patients' case note, communicate care plans to patients and fellow healthcare professionals, and perform procedures under direct supervision or Level 1 supervision under SMC's Supervisory Framework.  Department's requirement, if any (only for Clinical Fellow in this subspecialty): Preferably finished advanced surgical training or equivalent in their country specification.

Learning Objectives	<ul> <li>This fellowship would allow the Fellow to acquire:</li> <li>Multidisciplinary competency in disease management in cancers of liver, pancreas, gallbladder and biliary tree as well as other associated diseases and traumas.</li> <li>Hands-on training in laparoscopic and open HPB procedures with active involvement in major and complex procedures like liver/pancreas resection and liver transplantation.</li> </ul>	
7. Course/Training Syllabus	Comprehensive clinical exposure to HPB conditions by way of ward rounds, multi-disciplinary discussions, clinic exposure and time spent in the operating theatre.	
8. Training Method	Method of Supervision: Direct observation and feedback. Fellow will be supervised by an assigned supervisor at all times.  Observed Only: Fellows will have opportunities to observe hepatectomy / pancreatectomy / liver transplant.  Hands-On Experience: Fellows will perform or assist in the following procedures under supervision:

9. Assessment and Evaluation	Fellows will need to demonstrate their proficiency level based on the following competencies:  1) Patient Care Empathise with patient, show care for patient during consultation and in the ward.  2) Medical Knowledge Demonstrates medical knowledge expected of a postgraduate fellow.  3) Practice-Based Learning and Improvement To show improvement in medical knowledge and practical skills.  4) Interpersonal and Communication Skills Shows teamwork, works well in team.  5) Professionalism Shows professionalism in work.  6) Systems-Based Practice Able to carry out independent practice.
9.1 Assessment approaches	Fellows will be encouraged to meet with the supervisor at the start of the programme and lay down the objectives of their term. A mid-term assessment will be done by the supervisor and any difficult areas in training objectives will be addressed. Fellows are to maintain a logbook of the cases that they had been counselled on, or that were audited, by the assigned Supervisor, and have it ready for inspection by the Singapore Medical Council (SMC) when required.  Formative assessment:  Regular evaluation between Fellow and Supervisor / Head of Department Reflective journal- logbook recordings of training activities  Summative assessment: Periodical assessment reports as required by Singapore Medical Council  Feedback: End-of-training feedback form as required by Singapore Medical Council End-of-training feedback session with SGH-PGMI
9.2 Evaluation Process 9.2.1 General overall grading system	The general overall grading system evaluates the Fellow's performance upon completion of the fellowship programme. All Fellows will be given a general overall grading status at the end of the fellowship programme based on the grading criteria requirements incorporating the six competencies based knowledge, skills and performance that Fellows must demonstrate throughout the programme.
