4. Overview 4.1 Background information	The SGH Rhinology and Paranasal Sinuses (Nose) Fellowship has been running for many years, having been started by A/Prof. Dharambir S Sethi. We have a wealth of surgical cases that includes general rhinology, advanced rhinology, and endoscopic skull base surgery cases. Over the years, our fellows have come from countries including Malaysia, Nepal, Australia, and Israel, and have gone back to continue their practice in their home countries. Many continue to return yearly to contribute to our annual FESS Course as overseas faculty, and some have taken up leadership roles, such as HOD or President of their respective ENT societies.			
4.2 Goal/ aim(s)	To train the Fellow to be able to teach general rhinology cases, to be competent in managing advanced rhinology and anterior skull base tumor cases, and to be proficient in ENT-allergy work.

5 Pre-requisite /eligibility requirement(s)	 General requirements for Temporary Registration for training (required by SMC): A basic medical degree from an accredited medical university or medical school Passed the relevant national licensing examination in the country of conferment of conferment of basic degree, where applicable Evidence of at least 12 months houseman-ship / internship with a certificate of satisfactory completion of houseman-ship or equivalent Been registered as a medical practitioner in the country where he is currently practising Been certified to be of good standing by the Medical Council or the relevant national authority Note: The doctor should be in active clinical practice (and been registered as a medical practitioner in the countries of practice) for the 3 years preceding the application for medical registration in Singapore. In addition to the above criteria, Clinical Fellows must: a) Have a minimum of 3 years working experience as a medical officer (or equivalent) b) Fulfil English Language requirements of SMC if the medium of instruction for the basic medical qualification is not in English c) Preferably have obtained a postgraduate diploma or medical degree in his country or overseas d) Be sponsored by (i) the government, or (ii) regional health authority or (iii) an appropriate institution in the home country. For (d)(iii), the doctor must be on 			

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	current full-time employment (40 hours or more per week) with the sponsoring institution. As a Clinical Fellow, the doctor will be allowed to be involved in patient care and make entries in patients' case note, communicate care plans to patients and fellow healthcare professionals, and perform procedures under direct supervision or Level 1 supervision under SMC's Supervisory Framework. They will then proceed on to hands-on surgery and clinical sessions under supervision. This will cover all aspects of rhinology surgery and outpatient ENT cases. Hands-On Experience: Fellows will perform or assist in the following procedures under supervision: • Anterior skull base tumours • Sublingual Immunotherapy • FESS • Pituitary Surgery • Skin Prick Test No job rotation to other departments within SGH is required.
