New Courses

PGAHI strives to help keep healthcare professionals abreast of current knowledge and new skills in the respective healthcare fields. This is especially important in a rapid changing healthcare landscape.

Six new programmes were introduced in Calendar Year 2018, with each course achieving near full class size of an average of 22 out of 23 participants. This would not be possible without the commitment of the trainers for the following courses:

- Stuttering in School-aged Children: Is Treatment still Effective?
- Shoulder Rehabilitation
- Imaging of Lower Limbs
- Scar Tissue Release and Integration Technique (STRAIT) Method™ Course
- Training Fitness After Stroke: Putting It Into Practice
- Dysfunctional Breathing Patterns: Pathology, Assessment and Management



SGH Physiotherapists

Physiotherapists specialise in developing and maintaining people's ability to move and function. In addition to their clinical work, SGH Physiotherapy department has been active in fulfilling the clinical competencies of the local healthcare sector. Out of 76 programmes, 19 of them were initiated by the department in Calendar Year 2018.

SGH Physiotherapists also collaborated with other healthcare professionals as a multidisciplinary team to conduct training programmes at PGAHI. These courses include the Clinical Reasoning in Physiotherapy Management of Stroke and Vestibular Rehabilitation course. Both courses were well-received by participants with satisfaction mean rating index (MRI) of at least 4.0, on a 5-point rating scale, with 5 being the highest rated score.
