Continuing Professional Development Lecture: Implementation Science – What Is It and Why Do We Need It? 21 January 2021

Synopsis

On average, it takes about 17 years for about 14% of research findings to be adopted into routine clinical practice. This delay between what we know through research and what we do in clinical practice is known as the know-do gap. Implementation science, also referred to as knowledge translation, aims to bridge the know-do gap through the uptake and integration of evidence-based findings into clinical practice in a systematic and timely manner.
