

Continuing Professional Education Lecture: Lessons Learnt From COVID-19 Pandemic

Synopsis

The COVID-19 pandemic has undoubtedly changed the way many of us work especially during the waves or surges of cases. Pharmacists, as frontline healthcare workers, found themselves in vulnerable position as they spent significant amount of time clarifying drug orders and briefing patients on the medications they had been prescribed. The twist of events forced many to shift to delivery of services through telehealth and telemedicine. In addition, drug shortages not only highlighted the need for contingency plans for alternative supplies but added to the stress in managing the situation whilst pharmacists struggled to ensure their own mental well-being and safety.

We need to learn what went well and what did not work so that rectifications or preparations can be made to protect pharmacists and their patients from potentially another new wave or a new pandemic in association with another infectious disease pathogen.
