

Hello, Can You Hear Me? - Helping Your Patient Who Has a Hearing Loss

Introduction

The Singapore Association for the Deaf estimates that there are 500,000 persons with hearing loss in Singapore. With an ageing population, where 1 in 3 adults over 65 has a hearing loss, it is important for healthcare professionals to be able to identify and respond to the needs of these patients. This course serves as an introduction to this topic and will equip participants with basic troubleshooting skills for hearing devices, in order to facilitate good communication between them and the patients.

Course Objectives

This course aims to enable participants to:

- Identify different technological solutions that would benefit patients with hearing loss
- Acquire knowledge of care and maintenance of hearing
- Apply relevant skills in supporting patient with hearing loss in a clinical setting
- Acquire understanding of the hearing-impaired journey from diagnosis to intervention.
- Understand why patient needs accommodations in communication
- Spot the red flags where patient might have trouble hearing

Course Outline

This course comprises of theory and practical/hands-on components:

- Identify, troubleshoot and simple maintenance of different hearing devices
- Know different parts of hearing devices
- Identify poor listening environments for the hearing impaired with hearing devices
- Gain understanding of the of the process of diagnosis to intervention (tour of the SGH Hearing Center).
- Know the signs that a person may have hearing loss
- communication options available for the hearing-impaired person
- Acquire skills in communicating with a hearing-impaired patient through role play
- Hands-on activity with a hearing device
- Case study discussions
