



Stroke Guidelines Translation

21, 22, 28 & 29 Oct 2021

Introduction

This online course is designed for senior therapists working in stroke rehabilitation who are keen to optimize the delivery of evidence-based practice. Content will include a review of clinical guidelines relevant for stroke rehabilitation, an overview and practical tips on implementing evidence in clinical settings as well as facilitated action planning. The course will run over four half-days, to allow participants to develop action plans for implementation that are tailored to their local workplaces.

Course Objectives

- 1) Develop an understanding of how guideline recommendations are developed and the importance of delivering recommended care in clinical setting
- 2) Provide a framework to guide prioritisation of implementation of guideline recommendations
- 3) Acquire skills on implementation of priority recommendations
- 4) Create a draft action plan for implementing priority recommendation(s)

Course Outline

- 1) Updates on Australian Clinical Guidelines for Stroke Management
- 2) Overview of implementation science and theoretical approaches – How and why to use in practice
- 3) What to implement? Prioritising guideline recommendations for implementation in the clinical setting
- 4) Assessing the implementation problem (individual, contextual and guideline factors)
- 5) Developing and delivering implementation strategies that address the identified problems
- 6) Evaluating implementation

Dr Elizabeth Lynch is a physiotherapist and National Health and Medical Research Council Early Career Research Fellow, investigating implementation of the Australian Stroke Clinical Guidelines. She is based at Flinders University, South Australia.

Liz works closely with people with stroke and health professionals to investigate ways to improve how stroke rehabilitation is delivered. Her current projects include improving how information is provided to stroke survivors and carers after stroke, defining international centres of clinical excellence in stroke rehabilitation and developing and evaluating training resources to assist researchers and consumers to work together to improve the quality of stroke research.
