INTRODUCTION

This course will address current evidence and provide a holistic framework to guide clinical reasoning in physiotherapy management of people after stroke.

OBJECTIVES

At the end of the course, participants should be able to:

1. Understand medical management of stroke patients in sub-acute and chronic phases.
2. Be able to use the International Classification of Functioning, Disability and Health (ICF) model as a framework for clinical reasoning in management of people after stroke.
3. Understand the mechanisms underlying motor impairments following stroke and their impact on performance of everyday activities.
4. Be able to prioritise physiotherapy interventions based on analysis of impairments contributing to activity limitations.
5. Be able to identify prognostic factors contributing to recovery in people after stroke.
6. Be able to utilise motivational interview techniques for goal setting.
