



Problem Solving in Respiratory Care

24 – 29 September 2020

Introduction

This course introduces the “Problem Solving Approach” to contemporary cardiopulmonary physiotherapy practice. It is a simple framework that helps clinical reasoning, and guide patient management and outcomes through evaluation of clinical features and potential pathophysiological basis. This course aims to provide both physiological and scientific evidence to support the commonly used respiratory care modalities in local setting. This is an interactive course with case illustrations and practical components. The contents are appropriate for those who have some/ basic exposure to patients with cardiopulmonary dysfunction, and aims to provide specialised care by developing a systematic and evidence-based approach to respiratory care delivery.

Course Objectives

At the end of the course, participants should acquire:

- 1) The skills to assess, identify indications, precautions and contraindications & prioritise the respiratory problems amendable to physiotherapy techniques
- 2) Advanced knowledge on the rationale and scientific basis supporting the various cardiorespiratory therapy techniques
- 3) Abilities to identify physiotherapy techniques and adjuncts that are suitable for different respiratory issues
- 4) Practical skills to manage the various respiratory physiotherapy adjuncts

Course Outline

- Ineffective secretion clearance
- Inadequate respiratory volume
- Increased work of breathing

- Manual assisted Cough, MIE, Smart vest, Acapella, Bubble PEP
- Breath stacking, insufflation
- EzyPAP
- Bagging / Manual hyperinflation
- Positioning, breathing techniques, energy conservation
- Outcome measures
