# Clinical Reasoning Approach to Pharmacotherapy (Gastroenterology & Hepatology)

## 20 August 2022

### Introduction

Clinical reasoning is broadly described as the cognitive process through which practitioners apply their knowledge and clinical experience to assess and manage a patient's condition. An integrated clinical reasoning model is essential to enhance the practitioner's clinical reasoning skills in the delivery of patient care.

### Course Objectives

- To understand the concepts and components of clinical reasoning.
- To apply the clinical reasoning in daily pharmacotherapy practice for management of gastrointestinal & liver clinical conditions/diseases.
- To critically evaluate current evidences and integrate findings into daily clinical pharmacy practice.

### Course Outline

The course focuses on developing the clinical reasoning skills in pharmacotherapy of gastrointestinal disorders and liver diseases. The workshop shall integrate both clinical reasoning processes and application of pharmacotherapy processes using case-based discussions.
