<b>4. Overview</b>	<p>The programme aims to provide an integrated &amp; comprehensive exposure to general anatomical pathology – an increasingly complex area of practice. The Clinical Fellow works closely with a cadre of staff pathologists who run the active in-house general anatomical pathology service, which processes more than 45,000 benign and malignant specimens annually. Ancillary studies, including immunohistochemistry, in-situ hybridisation, and molecular genetics, are extensively utilised. In addition, a rich archive of interesting cases is available for study.</p> <p>Weekly didactic lectures and slide-based tutorials, covering the breadth of anatomical pathology subspecialties, are conducted for in-house residents. Each year, Division of Pathology and Department of Anatomical Pathology host several distinguished pathologist visitors from international academic institution who conduct educational sessions for staff and residents. The Clinical Fellow is highly encouraged to join these teaching sessions.</p>

5.1 Pre-requisite /eligibility requirement(s)	<p>General requirements for Temporary Registration for training (required by SMC):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A basic medical degree from an accredited medical university or medical school</li> <li>• Passed the relevant national licensing examination in the country of conferment of basic degree, where applicable</li> <li>• Evidence of at least 12 months' houseman-ship / internship with a certificate of satisfactory completion of houseman-ship or equivalent</li> <li>• Been registered as a medical practitioner in the country where he is currently practising</li> </ul>	

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	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Been certified to be of good standing by the Medical Council or the relevant national authority</li> </ul> <p>Note: the doctor should be in active clinical practice for the 3 years preceding the application for medical registration.</p> <p>In addition to the above criteria, <b>Clinical Fellow</b> must:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a) Have a minimum of 3 years of relevant working experience as a medical officer (or equivalent)</li> <li>b) Fulfil English Language requirements of SMC if the medium of instruction for the basic medical qualification is not in English</li> <li>c) Preferably have obtained a postgraduate diploma or degree in his country or overseas</li> <li>d) As a Clinical Fellow, the doctor will be allowed to be involved in patient care and make entries in patients' case note, communicate care plans to patients and fellow healthcare professionals, and perform procedures under <u>direct</u> supervision or Level 1 supervision</li> </ol> <p><b>Department's requirement, if any (only for Clinical Fellow in this subspecialty):</b> Not applicable.</p>

Acquisition/ enhancement of advanced, up-to-date skills in the pathological diagnosis of diseases, through: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➢ Competency in the morphologic criteria and differential diagnoses of various non-neoplastic and neoplastic diseases</li> <li>➢ The incorporation of special techniques in the pathologic characterisation of certain diseases</li> <li>➢ Frozen section rotations</li> <li>➢ Familiarity with tumour staging parameter and prognostic indices</li> <li>➢ Appreciation of the implication of pathologic diagnoses on clinical management</li> </ul> </li> <li>ii. Enhancement of collegiate skills through interaction with pathology staff, residents, and clinicians from other disciplines.</li> </ol>

9.3 Criteria for Early Termination	<p>The attachment programme will be terminated early on the ground of the Clinical Fellow's poor performance, misdemeanour, misconduct, negligence or breach of any terms stipulated or referred to in the Fellowship Letter of Offer and Institution Terms and Conditions.</p> <p>The Clinical Fellow may also request to terminate the attachment programme for reasons such as serious illness or other personal obligations. The institution will review all requests for early termination with the Clinical Fellow and the Supervisor / Head of Department.</p>
