For the fellows with interest in minimally invasive surgeries such as laparoscopic and robotic surgeries, the candidate will have adequate exposure and hands on opportunities with supervision in these surgeries.

4.3 Duration	3-12 months  The teaching/didactic requirements can be fulfilled within 3 months. However, with 6 or 12 months, trainees are able to complete sufficient numbers of procedures under supervision to perform the procedure independently after completion of this programme. The 3-12 months offers the flexibility to complete the training and also depending on the commitment that the visiting fellows and their institutions can invest.

	In addition to the above criteria, <b>Clinical Fellows</b> must:  a) Have a minimum of 3 years working experience as a medical officer (or equivalent)  b) Fulfil English Language requirements of SMC if the medium of instruction for the basic medical qualification is <u>not</u> in English  c) Preferably have obtained a postgraduate diploma or medical degree in his country or overseas  d) Be sponsored by (i) the government, or (ii) regional health authority or (iii) an appropriate institution in the home country. For (d)(iii), the doctor must be on
	current full-time employment (40 hours or more per week) with the sponsoring institution.  As a Clinical Fellow, the doctor will be allowed to be involved in patient care and make entries in patients' case note, communicate care plans to patients and fellow healthcare professionals, and perform procedures under direct supervision or Level 1 supervision under SMC's Supervisory Framework.

9.3 Criteria for Early Termination	The attachment programme will be terminated early on the ground of the Fellow's poor performance, misdemeanour, misconduct, negligence or breach of any terms stipulated or referred to in the Fellowship Letter of Offer and Institution Terms and Conditions.  The Fellow may also request to terminate the attachment programme for reasons such as serious illness or other personal obligations.  The institution will review all requests for early termination with the Fellow and the Supervisor / Head of Department.
