4. Overview 4.1 Background information	<p>During the fellowship programme, the Clinical Fellow will undertake a broad range of practical clinical experiences including care of inpatients and outpatients with acute and chronic neurological diseases, attending a programme of formal education activities, and have exposure to and involvement with current research activities. The programme will encompass rotations through Neurology inpatient and outpatient services, including various subspecialty clinics in Neurology. All training and rotations are designed to cultivate basic competency and proficiency in Neurology for Internists in General Medicine, or develop proficiency in an area of subspecialty for trained Neurologist</p>
4.2 Goal/ aim(s)	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) To be exposed to a wide range of neurological disorders with the aim for the Clinical Fellow to be able to practice safely and independently 2) To acquire interpersonal and communication skills: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Enhancing patient-doctor relationship • To communicate constructively and effectively with other Neurologists, physicians and other health care professionals 3) To develop a personal continuing education strategy and pursue lifelong mastery of Neurology and improve professional skills. 4) Able to demonstrate a commitment to carrying out professional responsibilities and an adherence to ethical principles.

5.1 Pre-requisite /eligibility requirement(s)	<p>General requirements for Temporary Registration for training (required by SMC):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A basic medical degree from an accredited medical university or medical school • Passed the relevant national licensing examination in the country of conferment of basic degree, where applicable • Evidence of at least 12 months houseman-ship / internship with a certificate of satisfactory completion of houseman-ship or equivalent • Been registered as a medical practitioner in the country where he is currently practising • Been certified to be of good standing by the Medical Council or the relevant national authority <p>Note: the doctor should be in active clinical practice for the 3 years preceding the application for medical registration.</p>

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	<p>In addition to the above criteria, Clinical Fellow must:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Have a minimum of 3 years of relevant working experience as a medical officer (or equivalent) Fulfil English Language requirements of SMC if the medium of instruction for the basic medical qualification is not in English Preferably have obtained a postgraduate diploma or degree in his country or overseas As a Clinical Fellow, the doctor will be allowed to be involved in patient care and make entries in patients' case note, communicate care plans to patients and fellow healthcare professionals, and perform procedures under <u>direct</u> supervision or Level 1 supervision <p>Department's requirement, if any (only for Clinical Fellow in this subspecialty):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Postgraduate medical qualification e.g. MMed or equivalent Minimum of 2 years of postgraduate training experience in relevant specialty (after obtaining the postgraduate medical qualification) Current position as registrar, Senior resident or equivalent
<p>6. Learning Objectives</p>	<p>This fellowship would allow the Clinical Fellow to acquire:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Clinical skills and acumen in the diagnosis and management of a wide variety of neurological disorders: stroke, epilepsy, dementia, neuromuscular problem etc. Basic interpretation of EEG and NCS Awareness of the role and benefits of a multidisciplinary team in management of neurodegenerative diseases, including physiotherapy, occupational therapy, rehabilitation, medical social work, nurse education. Some experience in clinical research in the field of Neurology if desired by the Clinical Fellow.
<p>7. Course/Training Syllabus</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> Observe and participate in management of acute neurological emergencies like stroke thrombolysis, status epilepticus, neuromuscular emergencies and CNS infections. Participate in ongoing daily teaching for residents and senior residents in Neurology training To attend the outpatient clinics to get exposed to various subspecialty clinics like movement disorder clinic, neurocognitive clinic, stroke clinic, sleep disorder clinic and general neurology clinics. To participate in ongoing research activities and give creative input To observe the procedures in Neurophysiology lab and learn how to interpret EEG and NCS <p>The syllabus remains the same for both 6 months and 12 months fellowship. 12 months duration will allow more accumulated experience of rarer neurological disorders.</p>

Nerve conduction tests and EMG 2. EEG 3. Neurovascular tests 4. Botulinum toxin injection clinic <p>Hands-On Experience: Clinical Fellows will perform or assist in the following procedures under supervision:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) Clerk patients and assess them to get differential diagnosis 2) Counselling of the patients about the diagnosis and counselling of caregivers about services available in SGH 3) Manage General Neurology patients admitted and also in outpatient 4) Participate in all the ongoing teaching activities meant for Residents and Senior Residents 5) Present topics in Journal Club 6) Collect Data and participate in ongoing research activities
