





EVIDENCE-BASED NURSING

Title: A review on the flexible work arrangements for nurses in the acute care setting



Focus: Definition of flexible work arrangement (FWA) among nurses in both inpatient and outpatient settings

Results: FWA encompasses a range of options that allow nurses to have greater control over their work schedules and locations, thereby promoting a better work-life balance. The types of FWAs available to nurses vary and can include options such as compressed workweeks, job sharing, part-time schedules, and telecommuting. These arrangements have been shown to positively impact nurses' outcomes in the acute care setting by reducing burnout, enhancing job satisfaction, improving work performance, and aiding in the retention of nursing staff.



Title: A review on horizontal violence of health care workers and effective preventive strategies

Focus: Ways to prevent or mitigate harassment and bullying in the workplace (healthcare setting)

Results: Addressing horizontal violence in nursing involves individual strategies like awareness and coping skills, while nurse managers and leaders play a crucial role through monitoring, authentic leadership, and improving work conditions. Organizations can foster a culture of intolerance, implement transparent reporting, and employ interventions, including training and workshops, to create a supportive and respectful workplace environment.
