



# Continuing Professional Development Lecture: Delivering patient-centered practice in healthcare – are we there yet?

## Synopsis

Patient-centered care (PCC) is an ill-defined concept although it is commonly considered a key component of developing high quality healthcare. Patient-centered practice includes the ability of healthcare professionals to value patient preferences in relation to their care. Despite professional expectations to deliver PCC, a biomedical and practitioner-centered perspective continues to dominate within many healthcare professions. In this CPD lecture based on her research and educational work, Prof Lesley Haig will present and explore different elements of PCC including:

- definition(s), role and applications of PCC in contemporary healthcare practice
- the importance of PCC
- the current state of play in patient-centered practice
- patient expectation and success criteria
- implications and challenges for healthcare professionals
- top tips for delivering effective PCC

## Speaker

**Professor Lesley Haig** is Principal and CEO of AECC University College, a specialist health sciences university in Bournemouth, UK. She has worked in higher education for over 20 years in a variety of roles as senior executive, manager, researcher, practitioner and educator. She spent the majority of her clinical career in musculoskeletal and sports medicine, working with elite athletes and teams nationally and internationally. She led the first MSc in Sport and Exercise Rehabilitation in the UK, which provided advanced practice education for musculoskeletal practitioners from a range of professional groups.

Her current research is focused on the practice and impact of training healthcare practitioners in motivational interviewing, a person-centered complex behavior change intervention. Professor Haig has many years of experience in developing academic partnerships in Singapore and is a member of the SGH Postgraduate Allied Health Institute (PGAHI) Advisory Board.
