

Influencing Behaviour Through Person-centred Approach (Part 2): Promoting a Person-centred Care Culture to Support the Needs of Persons with Dementia 17 – 19 January & 17 February 2022

Introduction

This course is an extension of Influencing Behaviour in Dementia Care Through Person-centred Approach course (Part 1). In this advanced course, participants will expand on the prior knowledge gained in Part 1 towards promoting a person-centred care culture to support the needs of persons with dementia. The presentation and discussion session will enable participants to deepen and expand their knowledge beyond direct patient care towards establishing a person-centred care culture.

Course Objectives

- 1. Review the Person-centred approach (PCA) using the Enriched Model of Dementia Care to influence responsive behaviours of persons with dementia.
- 2. Explain the case for Person-centred Care to promote culture change
- 3. Consider person-centred care principles to influence care practices
- 4. Apply strategies to promote adoption of person-centred care culture and/or practices
